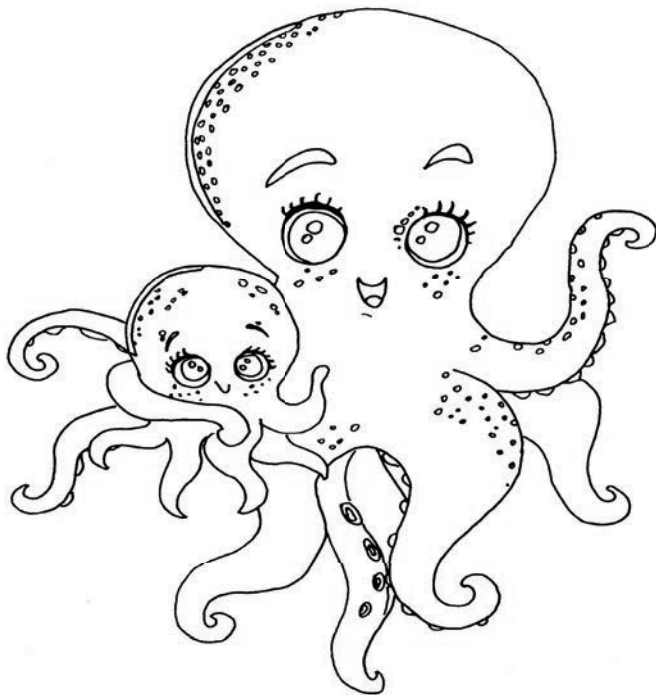

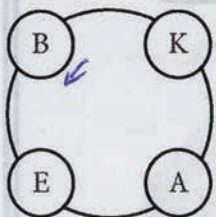

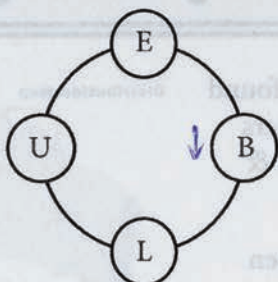

Gloomy Octopus Circle Words

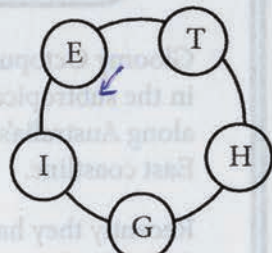
Our gloomy octopus words have been written in clockwise or anti-clockwise circles. Can you work out and write down each word?



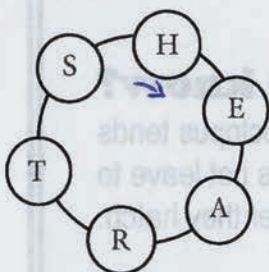

- They eat crustaceans, like crabs and lobsters.
- Octopuses have a sharp beak they use to crack open shells.
- They protect their home by laying shells at the entrance.



- Gloomy octopus tend to be solitary sea creatures.
- Adult females can lay up to 15,000 eggs.
- Octopuses can spray a toxic ink to ward off enemies.
- Gloomy octopus are excellent hunters. They stalk their prey.
- Octopuses are very smart. They can use tools and solve problems.
